During the Researcher Night at 27th September, we will discuss about our recent workshop "The three seasons of agriculture data: shall we talk about the fourth one? Empowering Agricultural Data Technologies through Skills and Policies: here comes the fourth one!" which aim was to create an environment for meaningful exchanges among experts and participants, by providing critical insights into various aspects of Agriculture 4.0, establishing a foundation for future discussions and innovations, and promoting an understanding of Agriculture 4.0 through the examination of how agricultural technologies, data literacy, and policy in advancing agricultural practices are utilized. The workshop was originally subdivided into three interconnected seasons, each of them representing Agridata technology, Agri-data literacy and Agri-data policy. They were leading to season four, which initially was expected to be represented by a synergy among the aforementioned seasons. Nevertheless, following the discussion among the participants, the focus of season 4 shifted towards other topics of interest. Moreover, during the workshop, a graphic illustrator was present to visually display the three seasons and the Season 4. Therefore, during the researcher's night, we will ask the audience to provide some words, sentences and/or images of what they think the Season 4 could be in order to add them to the previous illustration and to display a rich picture of the Season 4.

Digital Transformation in the F&B sector with DigiFABS



IVI is excited to be part of DigiFABS, an EU-funded initiative, bringing together industry and academia to support SMEs in

the Food and Beverage (F&B) sector as they adapt to digital transformation. The ambition is to empower SMEs in the F&B sector to develop the knowledge and skills they need to respond to rapid digital advancement in their industry. The consortium of 14 partners from HEIs, VETs, businesses, and network organizations represents 7 European regions of diverse digitalization levels and regions with high involvement in the F&B sector. In addition, the HEIs will engage 100 students from three disciplines and 10+ academics from IT, Nutrition and Business disciplines. They will engage 15+ SMEs from the sector to pilot the programme including a multidisciplinary action learning summer school and a live challenge for students to acquire digital, green and resilience skills to thrive in the sector.

The digital transformation capabilities in IVI align extensively with the requirements of the DigiFABS project. This 3-year project based on increasing capabilities and skills of F&B industry stakeholders in 5 EU countries (including Ireland) also capitalises on the IVI trademarked "IT Capability Maturity Framework", a framework created to derive real, measurable business value from technology. The framework assists organisations across industries, both public and private, in generating value and innovation. This framework, along with the digital transformation capabilities, make IVI well suited to lead the work package Summer School & Challenge (WP4), conceptualising a summer school to train students in their role as responsible dynamic digital change agents (RDDCA) for SMEs in the F&B industry. This WP will be based on the prior investigative work packages which aim to build a digital transformation maturity model for F&B SMEs and a skills concept for the change agents (RDDCA). This project is a step forward in strengthening IVI's commitment to digital transformation and leveraging its innovation capabilities in the F&B industry to help SMEs acquire the necessary digital skills to evolve.

PhD students in IVI attended Nemo Summer School in Vienna

The PhD students from Innovation Value Institute, Sana Kiran and Karthickeshwar Shankaravelu, attended Nemo Summer School 2024 during 15-26th July at the University of Vienna, Faculty of Computer Science, where they learned about the design and implementation of enterprise ecosystems based on conceptual modelling methods. They learn how to design semantically rich diagrammatic models that are both human-understandable and machine-processable. During the summer school, they collaborated on projects with participants from



various universities, generating ideas for a smart city context and subsequently designing a metamodel using the Scene2model and Bee-up Model platforms. Nemo Summer School combines lectures with practical work in multicultural groups, which significantly aids in learning about conceptual modelling from various perspectives and utilizing various tools in a smart city context.

IVI and Entrust Project Away Day
